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A Great Set of Tools

Soils are critically important. Data as to the capability and geotechnical properties of soil profiles are important to a wide range of uses: agriculture, urban or suburban development, subdividing land, or recreation. The type of soils and the properties of each unique soil profile have an impact upon land use and hence land value (at least to some degree).



“Web Soil Survey (WSS) provides soil data and information produced by the National Cooperative Soil Survey. It is operated by the USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) and provides access to the largest natural resource information system in the world. NRCS has soil maps and data available online for more than 95 percent of the nation’s counties and anticipates having 100 percent in the near future. The site is updated and maintained online as the single authoritative source of soil survey information”

The web site, above, is the portal from which information, as noted at left, can be obtained. The Natural Resource Conservation Service of USDA provides this valuable set of tools. It is an excellent web site. Knowledge of these tools should be required for anyone who professes to be a land broker.

Education & Training

GIS and the ESRI catalog and other tools for the geo-spatial analysis are available including distance learning via your computer.

Some courses are free others require payment to outside vendors.

Imagery— Aerials

Aerials are available from the Web Soils site. It is possible to zoom in and out of a site. Each geography will differ in terms of the age of the aerials.

Measurement

Use the aerial imagery to locate roads, fence lines or creeks. Then apply the AOI, Area Of Interest tool to draw a polygon. More than providing the template upon which to build soils data, the tool also provides the area— i. e. how many acres are in the site.

Ticks and other Nasty Critters

It is that time of the year, when ticks and other nasty critters are teaming the woods and grasslands. There are number of types of ticks; the blacklegged or deer tick (*Ixodes scapularis*) can be found in Virginia. Life cycle of the tick includes larva, nymph, and adult stages. “Seed ticks” are very small ticks are those at the nymph or larva stage and present the greatest challenge due to their size.



“Ticks do not jump or fall from trees. They rarely climb more than three feet from the ground on vegetation. We find them on our heads because they have climbed us looking for a suitable location to settle in. (Center for Disease Control and Prevention), as quoted from the book cited below.

Clothing

Wear light colored clothing—it is easier to see the ticks and then pick them off.

Put the bottom of your pants tucked into boots laced up tightly and/or into your socks.

Wear a hat; even though ticks are not supposed to climb, it is easy to stumble and fall in cut-over areas in heavy brush.

Brownfields Wanted: If you have abandoned or under used commercial or industrial properties with real or perceived contamination (excluding petroleum) with potential for re-development or reuse, you may be eligible for the Brownfields Land Renewal assistance. The Virginia Brownfields Assessment Program provides the Site Screening as a free service to localities with qualifying sites.

Land 101 Introduction Land Brokerage

In this introduction to the specialty, students learn the basics of land brokerage, such as: the various types of land; the land brokerage process; the importance of the 1031 tax-deferred exchange and how to use it; how to determine market value; what property rights and restrictions are involved; subdivisions and assemblage. The environmental and regulatory issues that land brokers must know and be ready to deal with are also stressed. *This course is required to attain the ALC designation.
